THE GREAT OMISSION



"Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely, I am with you always, to the very end of the age." — Matthew 28:19,20

As we come to the end of our Mission Emphasis Month, it is tempting to think of missions as something we support, something we pray for, or something that happens somewhere else. But Jesus' command is much more personal: **"Go and make disciples."**

Dallas Willard, in *The Great Omission*, points to a troubling gap in the church's understanding of the Great Commission. We have often emphasized making **converts** without giving equal attention to making **disciples**. Yet Jesus did not command us merely to fill decision cards; He commanded us to make people who would learn to follow Him, obey Him, and help others follow Him. Missions, therefore, does not end when someone hears the Gospel. It continues as that person is taught to live under the lordship of Christ.

Discipleship Is the Mission

The Great Commission is not simply, "Go and get people saved." It is: Go - Make disciples - Baptize them - Teach them to obey everything Jesus commanded. A disciple is not merely someone who believes in Jesus. A disciple is someone who is learning to live like Jesus and helping others do the same.

This means our mission field is not only across the ocean. It is in our **homes, workplaces, neighborhoods, campuses, schools, and churches**. The person sitting beside you on Sunday may need more than an invitation to church. They may need someone willing to walk with them. The new believer may need more than a Bible. They may need someone to teach them how to read it. The struggling Christian may need more than encouragement. They may need someone who will pray with them, listen to them, challenge them, and help them take their next step with Christ.

Missions becomes sustainable when disciples become disciple-makers.

How Can I Engage in Discipleship? You do not need a title, a platform, or a theological degree to make disciples. Start where God has already placed you.

1. **Identify one person.** Ask God to show you one person you can intentionally invest in. Perhaps a new believer, a colleague, a student, a family member, or a friend.
2. **Invite them to walk with you.** Discipleship happens through relationships. Meet regularly for coffee, a meal, a walk, or simply a conversation around Scripture. Ask, "What is God teaching you?" and "How can I pray for you?"
3. **Open the Bible together.** Don't simply tell people what you have learned. Help them discover Jesus in Scripture. Read a Gospel together and ask: *What does this teach us about Jesus? What does He want us to believe? What does He want us to do?*
4. **Practice obedience together.** Discipleship is not just acquiring biblical knowledge. Help one another put Jesus' words into practice—praying, forgiving, serving, sharing the Gospel, giving, loving difficult people, and caring for those in need.
5. **Help them disciple someone else.** Don't allow the relationship to stop with you. From the beginning, encourage the person you are discipling to invest in someone else.

Mission Doesn't End Today

As Mission Emphasis Month comes to an end, our mission does not. The banners may come down. The special services may end. The missions offering may be counted. But the Great Commission continues every Monday morning when we go to work, every evening when we return home, and every day God gives us an opportunity to influence someone for Christ.

Go! Make disciples! Teach them to follow Jesus and help them do the same!
